General Meeting Minutes NOVEMBER 25, 2025

The PVS General Meeting was held at the Antelope Hills Centennial Center on November 25, 2025 and was called to order at 5pm by club President, Dave Homestead. There were approximately sixty members in attendance. Club Officers present were Dave Homestead, Tess Morton, and Hal Vatcher. Karen Leffelman was absent, Daphne Homestead filled in for Karen as Secretary.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Tess Morton led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance. Following the pledge, Dave Homestead asked everyone to remain standing. Dave asked the membership to observe a moment of silence for those members who have recently passed away, or have had serious health issues.

ELECTIONS: No additional Officer candidates were nominated from the audience. Therefore a verbal vote was taken as every role had one nominee. By unanimous vote the following have been elected as Club Officers for 2026:

Bill Winans motioned to accept the donations, and Rich Morton seconded the motion. The membership approved the donations. Total donations for 2025 are \$18,000, as \$2,000 had been donated earlier.

TREASURER'S REPORT: As of October 31, we have \$4,430 in the Club account. Also \$6,994 in the Foundation account, and \$16,273 in the Foundation interest bearing account. Hal reminded everyone that these figures are posted on-line (Prescott Vette Sette website).

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Dave Homestead noted that the Secretary's Report for the October meeting is posted on-line (Prescott Vette Sette website).

SOCIAL COMMITTEE: Donna Johnson gave an update on the Holiday Party. She reminded everyone of the time and place, and explained the optional gift exchange (gifts are to be wrapped with no names on tag). She also informed the membership that there is construction blocking Smoke Tree Lane and advised attendees to use an alternate route.
