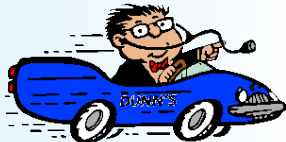

July 28 -- is our monthly meeting. The Bar will be open, but no dinner will be served.



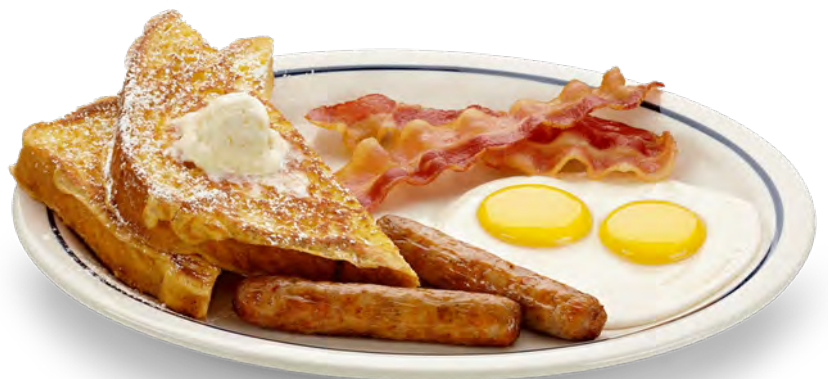

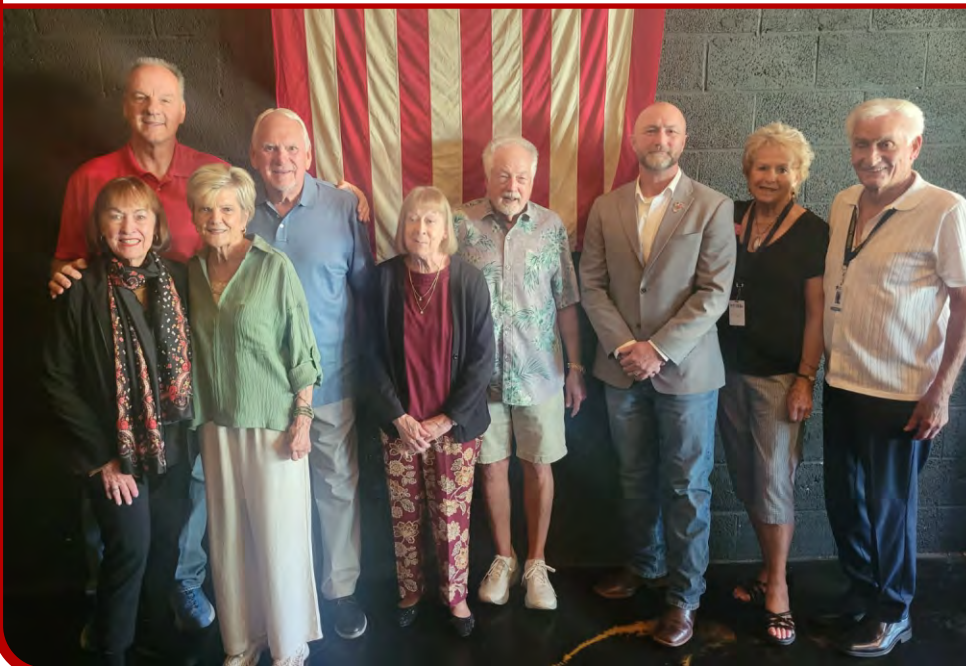

CORONADO TRAIL DRIVE-OUT ***JULY 7, 8, 9***

Last year, five of us drove the Arizona (only) side of this route. We unanimously agreed it needed a second night allowing more time to enjoy the scenery of the White Mountains and time to take-in America's largest open-pit copper mine.

July 7: Depart 8:45 after breakfast at Antelope Hills, then we head to AZ 260. We'll keep going after a **rest stop in PEYSON**, a brief overlook photo-op at RIM LAKES VISTA, and **lunch in SHOW LOW**. After a gas stop in Eagar, we really get into some nice 40 MPH driving in the White Mountains and arrive at HANNAGAN MEADOW mid-afternoon. The **lodge has its own** horses in the barns, and no cell coverage or internet. It's



July 8: Grab a breakfast bar, drive to ALPINE and take US 180 in New Mexico. An hour from Hannagan Meadow, we'll have **breakfast at ADOBE CAFÉ and BAKERY**. Most of the drive in New Mexico is lovely, but it gets back to desert scenery as we return to Arizona.

After **lunch in MORENCI**, we drive through the copper mine with its own overlook. You won't be disappointed with the size of the mine or its equipment.

Then we enjoy about 60 miles of continuous twisties, sweepers, and a few overlooks to return to HANNAGAN MEADOW. Drive at your own pace.

July 9: Get up, eat breakfast, and **drive HOME** on AZ 260, probably without some of the sight-seeing.

Interested? Look over the hannaganmeadow.com website. **As of the beginning of June, two cabins and two rooms in the lodge (31 Hill and 32 Hunt) are available.** Also, as of the beginning of June, there are 6 Corvettes and 9 people going.

Call Rhonda (928) 322-4082, mention "Corvette Group" to reserve a room or cabin. Then let **John Garley "mailto:jcgarley@gmail.com"** know you are going.

This is definitely a drive-out for radios. Buy, beg, borrow, or steal one.
